What is MaCCI?

“MaCCI” stands for “Mannheim Centre for Competition and Innovation”. Its major objective is to stimulate and disseminate research in the area of competition, regulation and innovation policy.

Who are the initiators of MaCCI?

MaCCI is an initiative by the Centre for European Economic Research (ZEW) and the Economics and Law Departments of the University of Mannheim. Launched as a virtual platform in 2008, MaCCI has been a ScienceCampus since January 2012.

2 MaCCI Snapshots

November 2019: The MaCCI Law & Economics Conference on Intellectual Property Proceedings

The conference provided an international platform for exchange and discussion between academic researchers and practitioners in public authorities, legal counsels, and economic consultancies.

The MaCCI Law and Economics Conference is organized for the ninth time since the inaugural edition in 2011. Last year the topic was “Intellectual Property Proceedings”. The conference consisted of two keynote lectures and four panel discussions covering the following topics.

- Proportionality of Injunctions in Patent Law
- Trade Secrets – Valuation and Protection
- What is FRAND?
- Using Alternative Dispute Resolution to Strike a FRAND Deal

June 2019: The 17th ZEW Conference on the Economics of Information and Communication Technologies

The objective of the conference was to discuss recent scientific contributions to the economics of information and communication technologies (ICT) and the economics of ICT industries from a theoretical, empirical and policy-oriented perspective.

June 2019: The MaCCI Summer Institute in Competition Policy

The 2019 MaCCI Summer Institute in Competition Policy brought together researchers to present and discuss work at the forefront of research on competition economics and regulation. The workshop topics included price discrimination, vertical foreclosure, horizontal merger policy, and the effects of minority shareholding on collusion.

May 2019: The ZEW/MaCCI Conference on the Economics of Innovation and Patenting

The goal of the conference was to present new research and to stimulate discussion between international researchers. The conference consisted of theoretical and empirical contributions from all areas of the economics of innovation and patenting.

May 2019: The 8th Mannheim Energy Conference

International scholars and practitioners in the field of energy economics were invited to discuss latest insights, new opportunities and future challenges concerning in the field of Energy Economics. The conference provided a stimulating environment for debates on issues fundamental to the energy industry, on policy implications of recent research, and new research questions arising from energy market regulation and policies.

March 2019: *Annual Conference of the Leibniz ScienceCampus MaCCI*

The aim of the conference was to provide a platform for exchange and discussion on topics in the field of competition and innovation between academic researchers and practitioners in public authorities, legal counsel, and economic consultancies.

The conference primarily consisted of parallel sessions that provided the opportunity to discuss original research papers from all fields of competition law and economics. The parallel sessions additionally included papers on business strategy related to competition, on the intersection between competition and innovation, and on regulated industries. Theoretical, empirical, as well as case-oriented papers were welcome. In particular, we invited lawyers to submit papers focusing on EU competition and/or comparative competition law.

Selected Achievements and Activities by MaCCI Members**2019: MaCCI Member Fetzer on Competition Law in Europe, China, and the U.S.**

MaCCI Co-Director Thomas Fetzer has continued a multi-year research project comparing selected aspects of Competition Law in the world's three biggest and most important jurisdictions: Europe, China and the U.S.. Together with Huang Yong from the University of International Business and Economics (UIBE) and Christopher Yoo from the University of Pennsylvania Law School Thomas Fetzer released the final report on "Due Process in Competition Law". The report has not only been published in China but will also be published in Europe and the U.S. Fetzer presented the findings of the report at several international conferences in China, including the 8th China Competition Policy Forum, which is the most important conference on competition law in China. Fetzer and his co-author Yoo also presented their work at an OECD working group meeting on June 4th in Paris. The project will continue until 2021 with a second working package comparing how the three jurisdictions deal with competition issues arising from Big Data and AI.

December 2019: MaCCI Member Martin Peitz at ACE Conference

At last year's annual conference of the Association of Competition Economics in Copenhagen, Martin Peitz contributed to the plenary panel "Reflections on the need for a reform of merger rules – Increased concentration and digital mergers" and discussed the German Facebook case.

December 2019: MaCCI Member Martin Peitz at on Digital Platforms in Brazil

At the second Rio Conference on Advances in Competition Policy Analysis, Martin Peitz gave an invited lecture on "Antitrust in the Attention Economy" and contributed to the panel "What has been learned about digital markets?". He also gave a short course on "The Economics of Platforms" at the Brazilian competition authority CADE in Brasilia.

October 2019: MaCCI Senior Member Volker Nocke on Mergers in Chicago

At the 12th Annual Conference on Antitrust Economics and Competition Policy in Chicago, organized by the Northwestern Center on Law, Business, and Economics, MaCCI Senior Member Volker Nocke gave a talk on "Merger Remedies in Multimarket Oligopoly". At the same conference, MIT-Professor Michael D. Whinston presented joint work with Nocke, titled "Concentration Screens for Horizontal Mergers."

February 2019: MaCCI Member Achim Wambach as Expert at Deutsche Bundestag

MaCCI member Achim Wambach discussed the Biennial Report of the German Monopolies Commission 2018, as well the recommendations of the commission with regard to energy, telecommunication, postal system as well as fixed book prices at the Deutsche Bundestag.

February 2019: MaCCI Members Martin Peitz and Achim Wambach at the Bundeskartellamt

MaCCI members Peitz and Wambach together with seven other German-speaking competition economists contributed to the discussions at the third meeting of the workgroup "Competition Economics" at the Bundeskartellamt.

February 2019: MaCCI Member Thomas Fetzer as Expert at Deutsche Bundestag

MaCCI member Thomas Fetzer gave an expert testimony on a revision of the German Telecommunications Act at the Deutsche Bundestag.

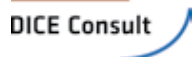
